



GREEN Charter School's Early College Program

Mission:

The Early College Program is a joint effort of GREEN Charter School and Greenville Tech College. It allows current sophomores, juniors and seniors to take classes and earn college credits from Greenville Technical College.

Eligibility:

Students must take a placement test called the Accuplacer in order to meet the requirements provided by Greenville Tech. GREEN Charter students will be offered the Accuplacer test, mid October, every year on GREEN's campus. Students are also eligible to take the Accuplacer at the testing center on Greenville Tech's campus.

GREEN Charter has the following Accuplacer score requirements for students to take Early College classes and have the tuition covered:

Reading 80 & Sentence Structure 81 or Elementary Algebra 107

Note:

- Most Arts & Humanities courses require Reading 80 & Sentence Structure 81 and no Math minimum
- ENG101: requires 3 years of High School English AND cut scores of Reading 80 and Sentence Structure:81
- The minimum scores for Math and Science classes vary depending on course, many of these courses have prerequisites along with a minimum Accuplacer score.

Fees/Related Expenses:

GREEN Charter students will not be charged tuition for Early College Program until June 2021. After that date the school board will evaluate the tuition program. Exception: Students taking classes during the summer sessions and students who drop a class after the Drop/Add window will be responsible for their own tuition.

GREEN Charter Students will be responsible for book and material fees.

Enrollment & Registration:

GREEN Charter's College & Career Counselor is the liaison between you and Greenville Tech. **All enrollment and registration paperwork must be handed to to the College & Career Counselor NOT directly to Greenville Tech.**

Students must complete these steps in the following order:

1. Take Accuplacer test and meet minimum scores
2. Conference with College & Career Counselor
3. Complete Enrollment packet
4. Register for classes with counselor **every semester** (paying attention to prerequisites and cut-off scores)

Communications:

Any communications of GREEN Charter students and parents regarding all aspects of the Early College Program will be done directly through the GREEN Charter's College & Career Counseling Department.

Parents are not to contact any Greenville Tech professor about their child's progress or coursework for ANY reason. Please discuss these concerns with GREEN Charter's College & Career Counselor only.

Transportation & Logistics:

Students can leave GREEN Charter's campus in order to attend Greenville Tech classes. GREEN Charter will provide transportation to Early College classes.

Students can only enroll in Early College classes if a grade of C or above is given in the previous college course. If a lower grade is received the student must take a semester off before enrolling again.

Sophomore Year (10th grade):

GREEN Charter Students are eligible to enroll in 4 Greenville Tech classes, two for each semester.

Junior Year (11th grade):

GREEN Charter Students are eligible to enroll in 4 Greenville Tech classes, two each semester.

Senior Year (12th grade):

GREEN Charter Students are eligible to enroll in 6 Greenville Tech classes, 3 each semester.

It is important that prerequisites and minimum test scores are discussed with GREEN's College & Career Counselor before registering for classes.

Summer Sessions:

GREEN Charter students are eligible to take classes during the summer but the student is responsible for summer class payments. Registration is still required to go through GREEN's College & Career Counselor.

Drop/Add Window:

Adding a Course-Greenville Tech's policy dictates that a course cannot be added to a student's schedule after the course has its first meeting time.

Dropping a course- Students need to conference with GREEN Charter's College & Career Counselor for a Drop/Add Form and submit the complete form by 4pm Thursday of the first week of Greenville Tech's classes. Students withdrawing after that time will receive a withdrawal on their college transcript. WP if passing at the time of withdrawal or WF if failing at the time of withdrawal.

Grade Conversion:

4 Year College Articulation Agreements:

The credits you earn at Greenville Technical College are guaranteed to transfer at some schools and apply to the student's bachelor's degree program without losing credits or duplicating courses. An example of 2+2 articulation would be where a student graduates from Greenville Tech with an associate degree and enters the four-year college or university as a junior.

Transfer agreements provide a list of specific transferable courses from Greenville Technical College to the four-year college or university. If you do not see your desired college on the list please call their admissions department and ask how the credits will be recognized.
